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## Brau de Bot

The Agricola Sant Josep cooperative was founded in 1962 in the town of Bot in Terra Alta in southern Catalunya. The members, many of whom are now third generation growers, farm a total of 500 hectares of vineyard, almond and olive trees. Brau de Bot was the cooperative's first wine made from vineyards owned and farmed by the members, and the wine local people would drink on a daily basis.

DOP Catalunya

Grape varieties: White Garnacha, Macabeo

Soil: Limestone

Harvest: Manual & machine collection

Winemaking: Free-run must and temperature-controlled fermentation in stainless steel tanks at 17°C. The Garnacha and Macabeo are vinified separately, and the wine is usually bottled in December.

ABV: 13 %

Total acidity: 4.8 g/l

Residual sugar: < 0.3 g/l

Total SO<sub>2</sub>: 70 mg/l

Bottle type: Bordeaux, 75cl

Closure: Micro-granulated cork or screw-top

Tasting notes: Pale yellow in colour. Fruity and slightly floral on the nose. Dry and crisp on the palate, and lighter-bodied than other wines from the region.
